### What is a Homeschool Co-op?

- Co-operation of homeschool parents
- Shared teaching
- Usually once or twice a week
- Usually parents teach

#### Variations:

- Stand alone classes
- University model
- Drop-off classes



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### **Watch Your Expectations!**

A homeschool co-op cannot replace:

- Your child's education at home
- · You, as parent
- You, as guidance counselor
- · Your family, as a major influence



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#### **Benefit #1: Socialization**

- A chance to make friends
- Cross-age friends
- Not overwhelming emphasis on peers



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# **Benefit #2: Group Learning**

- Group classes
  - •Gym, drama, speech, etc.
  - Hard to do at home
- Dynamics of group interaction
  - Class discussion
  - Leader/follower



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### **Benefit #3: Other Adults**

- Mentors & role models
  - Good for college and job recommendations
- Experienced & skilled teachers
  - Foreign language, art, advanced math & science
- Child accountable to another adult
  - Follow through on homework
  - Respect



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## **Benefit #4: Encouragement**

- · Homeschooling is not weird
- Sense of belonging
- Exchange information
- ·Sense of self



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#### Benefit #5: Fun

- Field trips
- Special events
  - Graduation ceremony
  - Parties
- · Family fun together



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#### **Disadvantages**

- Negative socialization
- ·Bad habits, attitudes, behaviors
- •Time
- School-like
  - Grades
  - Schedules
